KEY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

At Welcome Home, it is our honor and privilege to serve Veterans and their families who are literally homeless, Veterans and their families at-risk of becoming homeless, and unemployed or underemployed Veterans.



Emergency Shelter

Provides 32 private rooms for homeless Veterans & families, including a separate corridor for our female Veterans.

Rapid Rehousing

Provides supportive services to at-risk Veterans to help secure permanent, affordable housing options.

VETS Work

Provides job readiness training and direct support to help Veterans find and keep meaningful employment.

MENTAL HEALTH AND THE WAR WITHIN

War is never easy, but the war that goes on in the mind is often the hardest one fought. Howard was just like anyone else; he laughed when things were funny and cried when things were sad. Until the battlefield took its toll. Howard had purpose in the field; he was in control. But what happens when the physical war is over? You come home, and now the war is in your head. For Howard, that meant a slew of bad decisions that ultimately ended up in substance abuse, and extensive incarceration within the Department of Corrections. He knew he would have to fight that fight alone.

Enough was enough. When Howard came to Welcome Home he had little experience living on his own. From his selfless service to his time in prison he was constantly surrounded by others. Howard was so accustomed to this way of life he had trouble sleeping. It was no longer the thoughts in his head keeping him up at night however, it was just way too quiet.


Once acclimated to his new way of life, and with the support of Welcome Home staff and his fellow Veterans, Howard focused. He worked hard during his housing application process. He didn't miss a single VA appointment or Case Manager visit. After a short, 3 month stay he was connected with subsidized housing through Welcome Home's Rapid Rehousing program. Howard moved into his own home for the first time in years. Now, instead of turning to abusive substances to work out the kinks in his mind; he works out his body. When he is fighting those mental battles, his friends at Welcome Home are here to help fight alongside him.

Two ct: THE IMPORTANCE OF FAMILY


There is a strong sense of family amongst the Veterans that temporarily make this place their home. Jerry, a disabled Veteran, is no exception. After a short stay at Welcome Home Jerry successfully secured housing, alongside many of the friends he made during his stay. They were his new family. His living situation was no longer a problem; he was safe and secure. However, being a single leg amputee, his health was dwindling. Diabetes took Jerry's other leg in August of 2019. Even though Jerry was only in his early 50's, his family thought it would be best for him to transition into a nursing home; far from his new friends.


He didn't thrive in his new home and Jerry knew this new environment was debilitating. He knew it wasn't conducive to the success of his full recovery. Jerry reached out to his friends at Welcome Home and asked for help. He wanted to return to his previous home near his network, he wanted his independence. Welcome Home immediately jumped into action. After a few calls made by the rapid rehousing team, they discovered that his ADA room was still available. However, his medical situation severely hurt his financial situation. Jerry owed \$1,100 in back rent that would need to be paid prior to moving back in. His loving sister was more than willing to help out as long as Jerry was safe. Veterans United Foundation also offered a hand up, by paying his rent forward for three months. Welcome Home happily moved Jerry back into his ADA accessible apartment where he was surrounded by his newfound family; safe and secure.

It wouldn't have been made possible without his entire support system, his Welcome Home advocates, his family, and community partners, coming together to honor Jerry's service and restore his life.




